



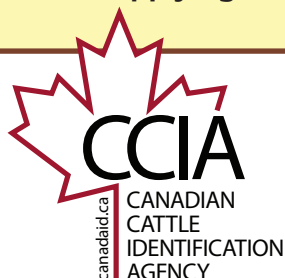
TAG DEALER or TAGGING SITE

What's the difference?

TAG DEALER vs TAGGING SITE

Regulated under Part XV of the Health of Animals Regulations	X	X
Requires an agreement from CCIA	X	
Declaration submitted to CCIA		X
Offers approved indicators (tags) for sale	X	
Applies approved indicators (tags) to animals brought to their facilities		X
Listed on the CCIA's website	Optional	Mandatory
Reports to the Canadian Livestock Tracking System (CLTS), which is the CCIA database	Under 174.1 a Tag Dealer is required to report the issuance information to CCIA within 24 hours of the sale of tags.	Under 183(2) a Tagging Site is required to keep the source and ID information about animals that have come to their site to be tagged.

The two designations can apply to a single operator. The difference to consider is: Dealers sell indicators (tags) and have the responsibility of issuing ID numbers to CLTS accounts and reporting to CCIA within 24 hours as per regulations. Tagging Sites only provide facilities and/or the service of applying indicators (tags) that are provided by the livestock owner.
